The benefits of recycling:

- Saves energy as it is always cheaper to recycle than to extract
- Limits global warming by reducing greenhouse gases

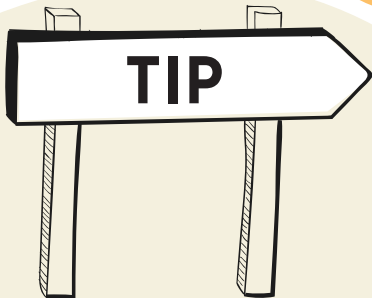
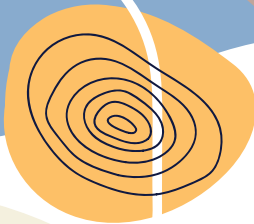


COMPOST

Please note that the following cannot be composted: citrus peelings, meat and fish.

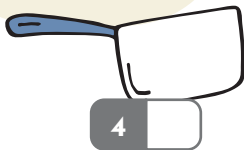
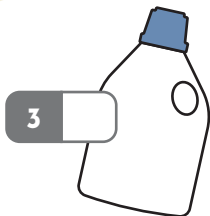
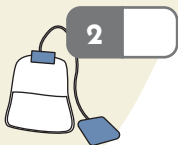
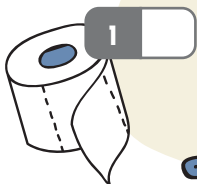
